

Colloquium: Vor 250 Jahren: der Fall Ayutthayas und die Gründung Thonburis (250 Years Ago: Commemorating the Fall of Ayutthaya and the Founding of Thonburi)

December 9, 2017 9:30 - 17:15 Room 221

Founded in 1351, Ayutthaya was the capital of Siam for four centuries. At the height of its power, it was one of the richest and most prosperous cities in Asia. Ayutthaya was renowned for its numerous temples and palaces, canals and rivers. Ayutthaya became known as the Venice of the East. Especially in the seventeenth century, many different nationalities, such as Chinese, Japanese, Portuguese, Dutch, English, and French, settled and traded here.

After the conquest and destruction of Ayutthaya in 1767, the Siamese kingdom ceased to exist as an independent political entity. Yet, within a couple of months, Siamese loyalists under the former governor of *Tak*, the later *King Taksin*, refounded the Siamese kingdom establishing a capital at Thonburi just opposite present-day Bangkok.

The colloquium aims at evaluating the significance of Ayutthaya for the history, literature, and culture of Thailand from various perspectives, including that of Europeans powers and neighboring countries such as Burma.


